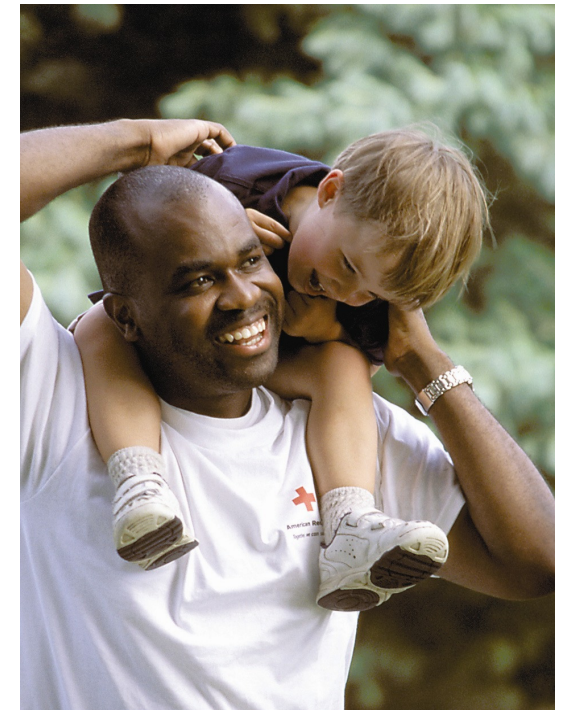

The Red Cross in Our Community

Disaster Relief and Community Disaster Education

When a disaster threatens or strikes, the Red Cross is there. This year we responded to 123 local disasters, including 116 residential fires. We helped 143 families of 506 affected individuals with emergency food, shelter and supplies in their hour of need. At least 54% of the clients were youth age 19 and younger or age 65 and older.

Because being prepared can make your family and community safer and sometimes minimize injury and destruction, we made 35 disaster education presentations serving 1,571 people in the community.

Health and Safety Services

From First Aid, CPR and AED training to babysitter's training and life guarding, American Red Cross programs help people lead safer and healthier lives. This year, 24,971 individuals learned lifesaving skills through 2,616 classes offered by the chapter. The Red Cross experienced a significant increase in the demand for the Family Caregiving and Babysitter's Training Courses – with 134% more participants this year, more than any other year.

A Note About Volunteers

We depend on volunteers of all ages and backgrounds to carry on our work. Over 500 volunteers constitute 97 percent of our total workforce, serving as members of the board, instructors teaching lifesaving skills, disaster action team members, office administrators, event organizers and more.

Service to the Armed Forces

The American Red Cross provides communication between those in the Armed Forces and their families. We have a worldwide network that reaches service members wherever they are to communicate a birth, death or illness.

The Red Cross is the only organization recognized by the United States Armed Forces to perform such services. This year the Red Cross assisted families with 332 emergency messages and requests to U.S. Armed Forces service members. The Red Cross provided information on emergency communications to 1,197 new enlistees and their families.

International Services

The International Services program offers tracing and messaging services to those who have been displaced or are seeking information on the whereabouts of family members following a natural disaster, war or internal conflict.

The local Red Cross is connected to the global Red Cross network which reconnected over 1700 families last year nationwide.

Multicultural Information eXchange (MIX)

MIX provides free translation, interpretation, referral, and tracing services to non-native English speakers assimilating into the community, also offered are cultural competency workshops to help local organizations effectively communicate with different cultural groups.

Last year, the Red Cross provided 1,380 interpretation sessions, translated 1,496 pages of documents and provided information and referral services 2,111 times. The Red Cross provided community services to 1,731 people.
